

Earth Under Fire: How and Why Our Climate is Changing

Presented by Robert J. Allen Ph.D.

Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences University of California, Riverside

Since the industrial revolution, global average surface temperature has significantly increased, likely making our planet the warmest it has been in the last millennium. This, has led the Intergovernmental Panel of Climate Change to conclude that warming of the climate system is undeniable, and that most of the warming is very likely due to the observed increase in anthropogenic greenhouse gases. Human caused climate change is now likely to continue for many centuries, including not only additional warming of our planet, but also changes in temperature extremes and precipitation, decreases in snow and ice extent, and sea level rise. We are venturing into the unknown with climate, and its associated impacts are likely to be quite disruptive.





Town Implements Water Conservation Technology

On an annual basis, the Town evaluates its turf irrigation systems for efficiency. Turf management and wise water use are achieved through technology designed to ensure efficient water use. As part of that overall process, the Town conducts annual water audits that measure the efficiency of the irrigation system. The water audits report recommendations for changes to the system to ensure maximum water efficiency and conservation of that valuable resource.






Annual Slurry Seal and Measure Y Road Maintenance Program Moves Forward

The Town Council awarded a contract to VSS International in the amount of \$922,000 at their meeting of May 21, 2019. The road maintenance program applies a combination of slurry seal and cape seal treatments, which maintain roads in good condition and prevent the roads from deteriorating to the point of requiring reconstruction. The project is scheduled to begin on September 4 and to be completed by mid-September, 2019. Pioneertown Road maintenance is impacted by the current water line installation project to Pioneertown. A separate schedule for Pioneertown road will be developed.





Road Repair on San Marino Drive

The Town of Yucca Valley's street crew performed an asphalt maintenance overlay on San Marino Drive, between Santa Barbara Drive and Joshua Lane. Prior to the recent project, potholes on San Marino Drive required repair approximately every two weeks, resulting in heavy usage of town staff and materials.





A leveling course of 342 tons of asphalt was installed to fill in the uneven roadway, in preparation for the final maintenance overlay, resulting in improved drivability.





The final asphalt overlay of 620 tons was installed by the four-person street crew on San Marino Drive in July 2019. Once the asphalt was placed, it was compacted with a vibrating steel drum roller.





With a total of 962 tons of asphalt installed on San Marino Drive, it has resulted in a smooth roadway and eliminated pothole repair until the installation of the HDWD sewer project. This project was funded by California Senate Bill 1: The Road Repair and Accountability Act.





Park Playgrounds Receive Updated Playground Surfaces

Playground surfaces must be maintained to ensure enjoyable and safe fall zones for all users, be that for those that use swing sets, slides, and all other playground equipment. Annually the Town evaluates the fall zones at all playgrounds and makes improvements to ensure enjoyable recreation activities.





Town Council Awards Library Reconstruction Project

At their meeting of June 18, 2019, the Town Council awarded a \$2.939 million construction contract to Diamond Construction, Inc., for renovation of the former PFF Bank Building, which when completed, will house the Yucca Valley Branch Library, of the San Bernardino County Library System. The construction project was initiated in July 2019 and is schedule for complete on or before March, 2020.

Dog Park Maintenance

Essig Park continues to be highly popular for neighborhood residents, including those with their canine partners. The dog park areas of Essig Park recently received needed maintenance efforts. The high volumes of users, including the four-legged kind that run and play hard while visiting and enjoying the park, results in walking paths and surrounding areas requiring maintenance. The Park Maintenance crew attend to the maintenance needs at all Town Parks, including the dog park.
