Administrative Services Director Yakimow gave the staff report contained in the printed agenda and retained in the files, and described the resolutions to be adopted. As of January 13, 2012, the Town Council became the Successor Agency to the

P. 1

Redevelopment Agency. He noted that the down side of the housing issue is that, while the Town is taking those responsibilities, it is not receiving the funds to do so. The low/mod funds are going back to the state, however, there is legislation going through to give those funds to housing authorities. There is also legislation going forward to delay the end of the RDA.

Mayor Rowe questioned what a successor agency is and what the oversight board is and who sits on it, noting that the Town Council Members as the prior RDA are the successor agency members but not part of the oversight board. Administrative Services Director Yakimow advised that is correct, but we may have a member on the oversight board.

Council Member Huntington questioned what the advantages are of not opting out. Administrative Services Director Yakimow advised the single most important factor as the Successor Agency is the ability to control as much as we can of the local dollars we have and ability to have control, he noted that none of the other cities in the county have opted out of being successor agencies. Town Attorney Laymon noted there are still a lot of potential legal challenges out there, and if the Town is not the successor agency it may not be able to take advantage of the outcome of those challenges.

Administrative Services Director Yakimow noted one of the recommended actions is to retain the functions of a housing authority, whether it is as successor agency or as a separate housing authority.

Mayor Rowe questioned how it would work if we take over the housing functions without funding. Town Manager Nuaimi commented there are unobligated low and mod funds that are supposed to be given to controller, but there is still debate regarding what is obligated and what is not obligated. There are dollars that do stay within entity. Funds previously paid into ERAF will be paid back. The worst case scenario is that we will end up with housing assets with a small amount of money. Town Attorney Laymon advised if the Town doesn't retain housing functions, those functions will then go to county housing authority. Town Manager Nuaimi noted that is a separate entity, not the county.

Council Member Lombardo questioned if the Town will still be in a position to reconstitute the RDA if the courts reverse things. Administrative Services Director Yakimow advised there may be a reinvention of some of the positive aspects of RDA, but resurrection of agencies as we know them is not going to happen.

Council Member Hagerman questioned who is taking the lead on updating agencies about what happening in Sacramento. Administrative Services Director Yakimow advised there are a couple of agencies, noting the main agencies are the League of California Cities and the California Redevelopment Association. Council Member Hagerman questioned where the assets would go if we were able to sell the PFF

building right away. Town Manager Nuaimi advised it will be the successor agency and the oversight board who are charged to pay down the obligations of the agency. If we were able to sell PFF those dollars would be set aside for retirement of bonds when we can retire them.

Mayor Rowe questioned if all assets are frozen until the oversight board takes control. Administrative Services Director Yakimow advised that is correct.

Council Member Huntington moved that the Town Council, in its Capacity as the Successor Agency Pursuant to Assembly Bill 1X26 adopt the following Resolutions: Resolution No. SA-12-01, affirming the Town Council's role as Successor Agency to the Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency; Resolution No. SA-12-02, authorizing the Town Manager to undertake all actions necessary to comply with AB 1X26; Resolution No. SA-12-03, receiving and adopting the Agency's Enforceable Obligation Schedule and Preliminary Draft Recognized Obligation Schedule; and Resolution No. SA-12-04, determining that the Town of Yucca Valley, as successor agency, elects to and shall retain the housing assets and functions of the dissolved Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency. Council Member Hagerman seconded. Motion carried 5-0 on a roll call vote.

It is recommended the Town Manager be appointed in the employee position. It is anticipated that the majority of the Oversight Board's work will occur in the initial year of existence as the members review existing obligations and contracts. It was noted that staff received communication from the Superintendent of Schools appointing Dave Price as the Board of Education's member.

Town Manager Nuaimi advised there is no stipend paid to the members of the Board so the recommended appointees can vote on the item.

Member Hagerman moved to adopt Resolution No. SA-12-06, appointing Mayor Rowe as representative and Council Member Abel as alternate to represent the Town of Yucca Valley on the oversight committee, as well as appointing the Town Manager to represent the employees of the prior RDA. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

1. Identification of Oversight Committee Board Members

Town Manager Nuaimi gave the staff report contained in the printed agenda advising of the make-up of the membership of the Oversight Board as stated in AB 1x26. The recommendation is to find that the County Fire Protection District is the largest Special District within the boundaries of the former Yucca Valley Redevelopment Area and consider recommending potential nominations to the County of San Bernardino to fill County seats on the Successor Agency Oversight Board. Town Staff put out a press release inviting residents to indicate their interest in serving on the Oversight Board, and received 7 responses. It is expected that the County Board of Supervisors will make appointments to the Oversight Boards across the County by the middle of the month.

Ramon Mendoza, Yucca Valley, commented regarding the need to make the board a citizen committee.

Margo Sturges, Yucca Valley, commented regarding the makeup of the board and the fact that the County is not selecting Council Members to serve on the boards because of conflict of interest.

Council Member Lombardo requested an explanation regarding the conflicts for sitting Council Members. Town Attorney Laymon explained conflicts in general, noting that AB 26 specifically says the issue of incompatible offices shall not be applied to the Oversight Board.

Mayor Rowe advised of her appointment at the last meeting as well as Town Manager Nuaimi to represent the Redevelopment Agency Employees.

Council Member Lombardo stated he feels the board should be kept within the agency that formed the RDA. Town Manager Nuaimi advised it is a decision for the County to make, however, they have been very supportive of RDA's in towns and cities and are looking for local input, so we can recommend members for appointment. Council Member Lombardo questioned if the board will have access to any financial advice. Town Manager Nuaimi advised that town staff will be staffing the Board, preparing the staff reports, presenting the information, and creating an asset management plan for the board's adoption, which is why there is an allowance for administrative staff, and there are also legal costs allocated. Council Member Lombardo questioned if there is a deadline for when the RDA has to be completely wound down. Town Attorney Laymon stated there is no hard deadline, noting it would be at the time all obligations are paid off. Administrative Services Director Yakimow advised that the ROPS has to be adopted by the Oversight Committee by May 15th but the Board can meet as soon as there is a quorum of at least 4 members appointed.

Council Member Huntington recommended David Cooper who is a CPA and was an 8 year member of the Planning Commission, Administrative Services Director Yakimow, and Robert Dunn who served on the Community Center Authority for a number of years.

Council Member Lombardo agreed with those three names.

Council Member Abel commented he does oppose recommending any Council Members to the County for their appointment and agreed with the three names recommended with the addition of Paul Hoffman.

Council Member Hagerman stated he is in favor of David Cooper and Robert Dunn, and questioned having 2 staff members tied up with the Board. Town Manager Nuaimi advised that the staff members will already be there anyway.

Mayor Rowe also agreed with the recommended names.

Council consensus unanimous to find that the County Fire Protection District is the largest Special District within the boundaries of the former Yucca Valley Redevelopment Area and to recommend David Cooper, Robert Dunn and Administrative Services Director Yakimow as potential nominations to the County of San Bernardino to fill County seats on the Successor Agency Oversight Board. No objections stated.

Discussion: Since February 1, 2012, the Town of Yucca Valley serves as the Successor Agency to the former Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency. As the administering agency, the Successor Agency is responsible for adoption of the fiscal year spending plan.

To assist the Agency Board in reviewing the proposed fiscal year 2012-13 budget, a copy of the Town Manager's Transmittal Letter is included as follows:

Yucca Valley Successor Agency

The proposed Yucca Valley Successor Agency budget for fiscal year 2012-13 is essentially a place-holder budget, representing the current expenditures that have been approved by the Successor Agency Oversight Board. Due to the ever-evolving nature of the wind-down process, it is unclear how the former RDA assets will ultimately be dissolved.

It is likely that both current legislation and litigation will influence how prior RDA assets may be utilized. However, until there is sufficient clarity regarding the expenditure of funds, the current proposed budget provides for expenditure of funds approved by the Oversight Board, the Department of Finance, and in some cases, both. It is the recommendation of staff however, that only those expenditures explicitly approved by the Oversight Board *and* the Department of Finance be expended.

Town staff will continue to work with the Agency's consultants, legal counsel, Agency Board, and Oversight Board to advocate a spending and disposition plan that promotes the overall economic objectives supporting the entire Morongo Basin. Such an approach will ensure that the residents of Yucca Valley and the taxing agencies of the broader community benefit from the prior Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency's efforts to develop this Town in an economically responsible manner. This approach may also dampen the continued shift of local monies to the State for their legislation needs.

Alternatives: Adopt and approve with modifications.

Fiscal impact: The proposed fiscal year 2012-13 budgets for all Agency funds are balanced, and reflect all current information received to date from the State.

RESOLUTION NO. SA-12-

A RESOLUTION OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY, OF THE TOWN OF YUCCA VALLEY, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING THE 2012-13 SUCCESSOR AGENCY BUDGET AND APPROVING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING ON JULY 1, 2012 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2013

WHEREAS, the Court's decision results in the implementation of AB1x26 which dissolves all the redevelopment agencies in the State of California as of February 1, 2012; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a provision of AB1x26, codified as Health and Safety Code § 34173(d)(1), the Town, in the case of a redevelopment agency of a Town, automatically becomes the "Successor Agency" to its dissolved redevelopment agency and is charged with the responsibility of winding up the affairs of the dissolved redevelopment agency pursuant to AB1x26, unless the Town council adopts a resolution electing to not serve as the Successor Agency and thereafter files a copy of such resolution with the county auditor-controller; and

WHEREAS, the Yucca Valley Successor Agency is required to provide an expenditure budget for the Agency's activities; and

WHEREAS, there are restricted fund revenues available through AB1x26 to implement the 2012-13 Successor Agency Budget as recommended.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY OF THE TOWN OF YUCCA VALLEY DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS.

Section 1. The Successor Agency adopts the Resolution approving and adopting the 2012-13 Agency budget and approving appropriations for the fiscal year commencing on July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013.

Section 2. To the best of the Agency's knowledge, the approved budget is in accordance with all applicable ordinances of the Town, Successor Agency and all applicable statutes of the State.

Section 3. Total appropriations within funds will be increased or decreased only by amendment of budget by motion of the Successor Agency Board.

Section 4. The following Officials are authorized to request and approve for payment purchases against budget accounts:
