Discussion:

New legislation adopted by the Legislature in 2011, AB 936, adds provisions to the California Redevelopment Law regarding the forgiveness of loans between redevelopment agencies and other public bodies. New Health & Safety Code Section 33354.7 requires certain procedures be followed when any loan between a redevelopment agency and another public body is forgiven, in whole or in part.

In addition, new Health & Safety Code Section 33354.8 requires redevelopment agencies and public bodies to adopt a resolution on or before February 1, 2012, stating

whether or not, during the period from January 1, 2010, through December 31, 2011, the redevelopment agency or public body has forgiven, in whole or in part, any loan made by the public body to a redevelopment agency, or any loan made by the redevelopment agency to a public body. A copy of the resolution must be sent to the Office of the State Controller and, if the body adopting the resolution is not the Town Council, a copy of the resolution must also be sent to the Town Council.

During the relevant time period, the Town has not forgiven any loan made to the Redevelopment Agency and the Redevelopment Agency has no loans outstanding to any public bodies.

Accordingly, staff recommendation is that Town Council and the Agency Board take the necessary steps to adopt the required resolutions and direct staff to send copies to the Office of the State Controller and, as necessary, the Town Council, in order to comply with Health & Safety Code Section 33354.8.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE TOWN OF YUCCA VALLEY DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, AND DETERMINE AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. During the period of time from January 1, 2010, through December 31, 2011, the Agency did not forgive, wholly or partially, any loans to any public body.
- Section 2. The Agency Secretary shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the Town Council of the Town of Yucca Valley and to the Office of the State Controller.
- Section 3. The Agency Secretary shall certify as to the adoption of the Resolution and shall cause the same to be processed in the manner required by law.

As part of the language of AB 1x26, on or before February 1, 2012, and in response to the court action regarding AB 1x26, the Agency Board must make any final amendments to its Enforceable Obligation Schedule and adopt a Preliminary Draft Recognized Obligation Schedule before transmitting the items to the Town Council as

Successor Agency.

The Enforceable Obligation Schedule must list all obligations of the Redevelopment Agency that are enforceable including the following:

- 1 Bonds
- 2. Required debt service
- 3. Reserve set-asides
- 4. Payments required under the indenture or similar documents governing the issuance of any outstanding bonds of the Redevelopment Agency
- 5. Loans of moneys borrowed by the Redevelopment Agency, including, but not limited to, moneys borrowed from the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund
- 6. Payments required by the federal government
- 7. Preexisting obligations to the state
- 8. Obligations imposed by state law
- 9. Legally enforceable payments required in connection with the Redevelopment Agency's employees, including, but not limited to, pension payments, pension obligation debt service, and unemployment payments
- 10. Judgments or settlements,
- 11. Legally binding and enforceable agreements or contracts
- 12. Contracts or agreements necessary for the continued administration or operation of the Redevelopment Agency to the extent, including, but not limited to, agreements to purchase or rent office space, equipment and supplies, and insurance.

The Redevelopment Agency previously adopted an Enforceable Obligation Schedule in August of 2011. However, it is necessary to update and make any final amendments to the Enforceable Obligation Schedule before transmitting it to the Town of Yucca Valley, acting as the Successor Agency to the Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency. Accordingly, staff has updated and amended the Enforceable Obligation Schedule.

A second action is also required approving a Preliminary Draft Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (PDROPS) for the first six months of 2012. The PDROPS allows the Successor Agency to make payments, other than for bonded indebtedness, in accordance with the language included in AB 1x26. The PDROPS is needed so that pledges of revenues associated with enforceable obligations of the former redevelopment agency are honored.

In light of the forgoing, the PDROPS is included as part of this staff report, along with the requisite resolution adopting the schedule and transmitting the PDROPS to the Successor Agency with instructions to post the schedules on the website and deliver the schedules to appropriate state and county bodies.

Staff recommends approval of the resolution in order to be able to make the necessary payments for various obligations and to authorize the Executive Director or Treasurer of the Agency to sign all paperwork and to take all necessary actions to forward the

documents to the Successor Agency, State and County.

Financial Impact: The elimination of the Redevelopment Agency will effectively remove the primary economic development tool available to the local community. While a token amount of administrative monies are provided to the Successor Agency for wind-down activities, the flexibility, resources, and funding the community once had are eliminated. Staff will bring an expanded financial discussion as the implementation path of AB 1x26 is further developed at the State and County level.

RESOLUTION NO. RDA-12-

A RESOLUTION OF THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE TOWN OF YUCCA VALLEY, CALIFORNIA AMENDING AND UPDATING ITS ENFORCEABLE OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE (EOPS) AND ADOPTING A PRELIMINARY DRAFT RECOGNIZED OBLIGATION PAYMENT SCHEDULE (PDROPS) PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE § 34176 AND TRANSMITTING THE DRAFT PDROPS TO THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY

WHEREAS, the Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency ("Redevelopment Agency") is a public body, corporate and politic, organized and existing under the California Community Redevelopment Law (Health & Safety Code §§ 33000 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Yucca Valley is a municipal corporation and a general law city organized and existing under the Constitution of the State of California ("Town"); and

WHEREAS, on December 29, 2011, the California Supreme Court issued its opinion in the case *California Redevelopment Association, et al. v. Ana Matosantos, etc., et al.*, Case No. S196861, and upheld the validity of Assembly Bill 1x26 ("AB1x26") and invalidated Assembly Bill 1x27; and

WHEREAS, the Court's decision results in the implementation of AB1x26 which dissolves all the redevelopment agencies in the State of California as of February 1, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Town is, by operation of law, the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency for purposes of winding-down the Redevelopment Agency under AB1x26; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a provision of AB1x26, codified as Health and Safety Code Section 34176, the Town as Successor Agency is required to maintain an "Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedule" (the "EOPS"), which schedule was adopted by the Agency on August 23, 2011, by Resolution No. RDA-11-08. The Agency now wishes to amend and update its EOPS; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a provision of AB1x26, codified as Health and Safety Code Section 34176, the Agency is required to adopt a "Preliminary Draft Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule ("PDROPS") and transmit such PDROPS to the Successor Agency. A PDROPS was adopted on September 20, 2011; however, as a result of the judicial stay and decision from California Redevelopment Association, et al. v. Ana Matosantos, etc., et al., the Agency is required to re-adopt and update such PDROPS; and

WHEREAS, the Agency, having considered the matter, has determined, in its legislative discretion, that it is in the best interests of the Agency to update and amend the EOPS and adopt a PDROPS and transmit these schedules to the Successor Agency. The PDROPS shall be posted on the Agency's website or, in the event of the Agency's dissolution under AB1x26, on the Successor Agency's website; and

WHEREAS, Health & Safety Code Section 34169 requires redevelopment agencies to provide the PDROPS to their successor agency so that pledges of revenues associated with enforceable obligations of the former redevelopment agency are honored; and

WHEREAS, the Agency reserves the right, regardless of any actions taken pursuant to this Resolution, to challenge the legality of AB1x26 and seek reimbursement for compliance costs of this state-mandated program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Yucca Valley Redevelopment Agency, resolves as follows:

- Section 1. The foregoing Recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein.
- Section 2. The amended and updated EOPS, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A", is hereby adopted pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 34169(g).
- Section 3. The PDROPS, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "B", is hereby adopted pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 34169(h).
- Section 4. The Executive Director or his designee is hereby directed to transmit the EOPS and PDROPS to the Town of Yucca Valley acting in its capacity as Successor Agency.
- Section 5. The Executive Director or his designee is hereby directed to post this Resolution, the amended EOPS, and the PDROPS on the Agency's website and to provide notice of adoption of the EOPS and the PDROPS to the County auditor-controller, the State Controller and the State Department of Finance. A notification providing the website location of the posted schedules and notifications of any amendments shall suffice to meet this requirement.
